The trail is suitable for users of every level of conditioning. Creek vistas, restrooms, and picnic areas are strategically located along the trail. The trail follows the path of development of the oil industry in the 1860's. The story is told by interpretive panels.

McClintock Trail	A "share the road" trail from Oil Creek State Park south to Oil City. In January, 2009, McClintock Trail Phase I was completed. This 1.8-mile section of trail that travels along Waitz Road in Cornplanter Township extends from Rynd Farm south to the historic McClintock Well #1; it's open now to bicyclists, walkers, and drivers along the west shore of Oil Creek. Samuel Justus Recreational Trail	Developed by Cranberry Township and extended by Oil City, the trail is marked through the streets of Oil City from the northside to the southside of town. Then the trail continues along the Allegheny River 5.8 miles to Franklin. Allegheny River Trail	Bordered on the west by the Allegheny River and on the east mostly by woodland, this 28 mile trail is rural and quiet. Primitive camping and picnic areas are located along the trail. There are two railroad tunnels: the Kennerdell Tunnel, 3350' long, is 15 miles south of Franklin and the Rockland Tunnel, 2868' long, is 21 miles south of Franklin. The trail is paved through the tunnels and three rows of reflectors mark the trail edges and center. Both tunnels are very dark. Bring a light!
